

A remedy to unsightly and painful veins

Leading vascular surgeon Michael Gaunt discusses the treatment of varicose veins and threadveins

AVE you spent years putting up with painful and unsightly varicose veins? Have you dreaded showing your legs off this summer because you have been too embarrassed? Well, help is at hand thanks to the dedicated expertise of vascular surgeon Michael Gaunt who explains that the problems are very common.

"With an estimated 20% of the population suffering from varicose veins, there is no need to feel embarrassment," said Mr Gaunt.

"And you shouldn't delay, as ignoring the problems will only make them far worse." Award-winning Mr Gaunt performs hundreds of procedures a year, on both varicose veins and thread veins, often caused by wear and tear on the skin.

He is also a pioneer of the Endovenous Laser technique at the BMI St. Edmunds Hospital. In his 25 years practising, he has seen firsthand the effects of ignoring varicose veins, listing venous eczema and venous ulceration as problems that can occur if left untreated. He has also seen medical advances which make treatment of troublesome veins much more straightforward. Mr. Gaunt reflects and says, "Where once it required major surgery and a hospital stay, this is no longer the case. Modern techniques can be performed under local anaesthetic, with pinhole incisions, a four-hour stay in hospital and a return to work within one or two days rather than weeks. If you go to the right person, you can be back on your feet in no time, the difference to someone's life is amazing." A former patient of Mr Gaunt, Mrs C said: "I would highly recommend anyone suffering with problems - be they cosmetic or physical - as a result of damaged veins to talk through the options with Mr Gaunt. The improvement to my health and fitness has been phenomenal and is difficult

to put into words. My only regret is not having known about or having had the operation sooner."

Last year Mr Gaunt became one of the first surgeons in the UK to offer the Clarivein treatment which further simplifies the procedure of treating varicose veins. He explained: "As well as needing less local anaesthetic, it is even less invasive than current treatments due to the use of a special catheter which combines mechanical and chemical energy to seal off the problem vein."
